- BBC Studios – **Charles R: The Making of a Monarch** (Dir: Tim Kirby) – Documentary (1 hour). *Commissioned to start the BBC's coverage of the coronation of King Charles III, constructed entirely from archive and using only the words of the King from interviews throughout his life, this film documents the life of the monarch from birth to his coronation.*
- Windfall Films for National Geographic – **Pride from Above** (Dir: Jen Kerrison) – Documentary (1 hour). *A celebration of LGBTQIA+ Pride events as part of the Europe from Above series.*
- Naked TV for Paramount Plus/Channel 5 – **How the Other Half Live with Brian Cox** (Dir: Tristan Quinn) – Documentary (1 hour). *From his roots in Dundee to his role as Logan Roy in the HBO series Succession, Brian Cox has had a difficult relationship with money. In this documentary he seeks to understand how wealth – or the lack of it – shapes our world.*

- BBC 1 – **Imagine: Books - The Final Chapter?** (Dir: Tim Kirby) – Documentary (1 hour). *Will the rise of the eBook destroy the traditional bound paper book? Will authors and the publishing industry survive the changes in technology? Alan Yentob looks at an art form on the cusp of its biggest upheaval since the invention of printing.*
- BBC 4 – **Climate Change: A Horizon Guide** (Dir: Ben Wilson) – Documentary (1 hour). *From the early pioneers in the 1950s to the general consensus of today, this documentary follows the scientific and political highs and lows of climate research.*

How is it that some of the descendants of a destitute 19th Century woman are still on benefits, whilst others have become wealthy?*
- Lion TV for Channel 5 – **The Secret Life of the Holiday Resort** – Documentary (3 x 1 hour). *The series follows the star and holiday-makers at an all-inclusive resort on the Spanish Costa Blanca.*
